From the Rector

Dear Friends,

On Sunday the 7th of June we are pleased to welcome Bishop Richard to the Parish. Bishop Richard is going to Confirm some young people from the parish and also commission our Local Ministry Development Group. We are especially glad to welcome friends and family members to this service.

Confirmation is the sacrament of the Holy Spirit. Jesus speaks of the Spirit as an advocate, someone who understands the issues and argues for the truth, someone who helps with communication. There will come a time, Jesus tells his disciples, when he will no longer be there to speak to people about himself and about God. That task will then belong to his followers. But they will not be on their own.

The story of the day of Pentecost shows this working in practice. The disciples have lived through momentous events, and experienced strong emotions. They are exhausted, confused, and a little afraid. But then something miraculous happens that turns their world upside down once again. And the result is communication. Suddenly they have words. They can go out into the street with confidence and tell the crowds what has happened, and the crowds can hear them. The Church has found its voice, a voice that has reverberated down the centuries, telling of the overwhelming love of God shown in Jesus.

Communication in our world today is sophisticated and incessant. In that context, it is even more important that



we are careful in how we talk about God, and in how we listen to those around us.

We are in a better position than the first disciples. We have easy access to the words of many Christian thinkers and scholars. We have the New Testament, the earliest testimony to the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and reflections on its meaning. We can listen to the Spirit of God in the scriptures and the Church as well as in our own experience. We have the resources to help us communicate well in our time and place. Those being confirmed and commissioned can be confident that God is with them and that they are speaking his words. Thank God for the gift of the Spirit, our advocate, who helps it to be so.

Whitbourne WI..

On a lovely sunny evening we gathered for our May meeting. We began with the business part of the evening which was quite riotous. Apologies were taken and Birthday posies were given out. Minutes were presented and matters arising dealt with.

June's meeting will be at Whitbourne Hall where we are going to play Smite. This will be at 2.30pm, afternoon being preferred to evening in case we have an infestation of midges. Tea and cakes will be provided.

Correspondence was then dealt with. We are invited to Alfrick on 10th June, at White House Farm. Other business was discussed.

Our speaker Mr Mark Wilkins from County Air Ambulance was introduced. He learned to fly helicopters in Middle Wallop, did commercial flying, and then moved up to Scotland, eventually joining the Air Ambulance. He explained that all the pilots are forces trained, and that the paramedics are from the NHS. There are 34 air ambulances across the country; all are supported by charity with no government support. NHS funding is only provided for

flying patients from one area to an NHS Centre of Excellence or transport of organs for transplants.

West Midlands Air Ambulance was set up in 1990 to serve the 10 counties with 1 helicopter based at RAF Cosford. The area covered means that the chopper can reach a patient within 20 minutes. There are now 6 on call in the West Midlands; by far the greater numbers of call-outs are to road traffic accidents. Farm accidents also come high on the list. Pilots fly every day of the year, but not at night.

£1.5 million is needed each year to keep the air ambulance flying. An appeal is in progress at the moment for all hospitals to provide a helipad on site to ensure delivery of patients **within the 'golden hour' during which** severe injuries can most effectively be treated. We then watched a video designed to raise money for this appeal.

There were questions, and Anne thanked Mark for his interesting talk. Contributions were put in his tin and members took some information sheets. There were further discussions over the tea and cakes.

We have found our banner which is going on display at the Three Counties Show.

Don't forget our next meeting is at 2.30pm on 9th June, meet at the gateway to the outer courtyard at Whitbourne Hall for a game of SMITE!

Letter from the Dean of Hereford

Following the General Election, we again have a single party with a small overall majority. The new landscape with Scotland almost entirely SNP and England Conservative brings with it a new landscape in respect of future devolution, the distribution of power and how government operates. We may be tired of the endless political chatter. Nevertheless now is a moment to reflect on power and indeed how so often we both take it for granted in so many places and then contrarily in other places focus endlessly upon it.

The well worn adage: *Power corrupts and absolute power corrupts absolutely* is often taken as a way of judging power to be a dangerous thing if not bad in itself. But is it? Very often the powerful are judged with suspicion. Isn't that adage much more about us and the way we use power than about power itself? If we take a moment to look at our lives, from the cars we drive to the gadgets in our homes to the medical advances we take for granted, are not all of these linked to knowledge and that to power to use that knowledge powerfully? Surely what power does, if we will but allow it, is enable us to take a good hard look at ourselves, our motives and our choices. It uncomfortably allows us to see our flawed human nature and our ability to act for good or ill.

Early in the year Baroness Martha Lane Fox, giving the annual Dimpleby lecture, extolled a world vision involv-

ing a far greater understanding and use of the internet. She argued for its use to come under some digital public institution and not simply be that of private entertainment or commercial transaction. It was a compelling, if somewhat utopian vision of what could be achieved through the power of this ever speeding digital revolution. There is much in what she says that needs to be heeded. However it is a naive person who doesn't recognise that the internet has a dark as well as a productive side; power for good or ill. The ancient myth of the Tower of Babel may be an unusual place to turn but it does provide at least one way to reflect on this most powerful tool of our age. Babel is a story of global communication, autonomous human enterprise and how it went wrong. That ancient story highlights just how dangerous it can be when human beings seek to act like God, to overreach themselves in their use of power coupled to pride and arrogance. The result is chaos, confusion and fragmentation.

We are now firmly in the season of Pentecost with its celebration of God's powerful outpouring of the Holy Spirit- God's own presence to be with us and in us. This season encourages us to receive this power and presence. Here is power to sanctify our daily lives, shape our choices for good and empower us to humbly be part of God's reconciling work in the world. +Alistair

Rogationtide Walk 10th May

But the best bit, of course, was the fellowship, with countless new conversations struck up as the group got rearranged at each obstruction (e.g. wobbly stiles).

We didn't quite keep to schedule, with several opportunities for refreshment and loo stops – many thanks to those who provided these so generously on the way. In the past we have had some difficulty following paths across fields, but not this time – thanks to the farmers. Finally, thanks to our leader, David H who led appropriate prayers at each church; our “transporters”, Sylvia and John A; and to Tom Fisher, the North Bromyard Footpaths Officer

who did so much to make sure our route was clear and ready. Same again next year?

Rogation Day, in Ascension week, has been used for various purposes in the **past, from asking God's forgiveness** for sins, to blessing crops, fasting and abstinence. Usually there was a walk, to mark either boundaries or rights **of way. More recently it was 'beating the bounds' when choirboys were** beaten at boundary markers, encouraging them to remember the parish boundaries. 

Food Bank Collection at the Village Shop

A big thank you from the organisers of the Bromyard Food Bank to all those who have already donated through the Village Shop.

Our local food bank needs donations to help families facing hardship in this area. The Bromyard Food Bank has already supported people in Whitbourne and surrounding areas and they anticipate that the need will increase.

The Food Bank gets referrals from Social Services in Hereford and also Citizens Advice Bureau who know of

local people who have lost their jobs or who are on zero hours contracts **which don't pay enough to live on.** They also get referrals from the **Doctor's surgery, the local schools, the Clergy and Age Concern.** They find that people are reluctant to phone up themselves and ask for help.

Volunteers then make up an appropriate box which will last a week.

Usually within a few weeks the recipients manage to sort things out and no longer have a need. If you would like to help there is a box in the village shop for donations. Please put non-perishable items with a long use by date. They need dry goods, baby items, toiletries and tins (not baked beans and spaghetti as everyone gives these!) *Liz Cousins*

Clifton Upon Teme Primary School Update

This week sees the culmination of months of preparation for the pupils of Clifton upon Teme Primary School. **The school's garden at the RHS Spring Festival** was project-managed by the School Council, and every child has had the opportunity to plan, build and plant the garden.

Based on the theme of 'The Route to The Hills', five concepts were presented by different groups, and voted on to choose the best. The school then invited floral artist, Shane Connolly, in to school to share his experience of using plants to convey emotions, ideas and moods.

The next few months saw the children creating and refining their ideas to draw up a final plan, together with a number of fundraising activities, **including a 'vegetable fashion show',** a fun run and a butterfly biscuit sale.

Headteacher Cathryn Throup said, **"This has been a marvellous project** for our pupils. It is entirely their own work; planting seeds and bulbs, weaving willow, tending plants, making the bat box, the steam engine and the in-

sect hotel, felting the butterflies and painting the backboards. I am immensely proud of our exceptional children, and the finished garden **took my breath away!"**

During the last two weeks, groups of children have spent days over at the Malvern showground installing and planting the garden. The help of staff, Governors and parents was sought to handle the heavy lifting!

We are very proud that, in the judging, the garden was awarded **'Distinction'** - the highest grade!


